## Transaction Summary

We are providing the rating of AMMC CLO 20 as a Non-NRSRO rating. The transaction closed on March 29, 2017. It had a reinvestment period, which ended on April 19, 2021. It has a maturity date of April 17, 2029. The investments were callable as of October 17, 2019. The Dealer and Trustee were Societe Generale and U.S. Bank, respectively. The issued notes are collateralized by 99.65% senior secured loans, cash, and eligible investments with the balance of the portfolio consisting of 0.35% second lien loans and senior unsecured loans. American Money Management Corp serves as the collateral manager.

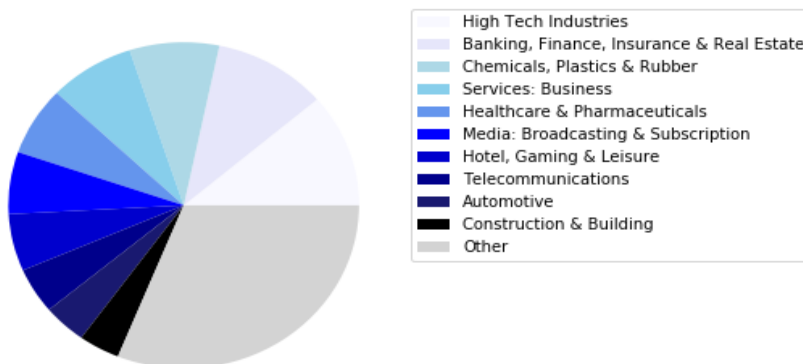
As of July 28, 2020, the total balance of the underlying assets was approximately \$399.4M. The diversity score of the portfolio was 75. EJR's weighted average rating score and weighted average life (years) of the collateral were 4966 and 4.32, respectively. 13.76% of the portfolio's assets were rated CCC+ or less by other NRSROs. Senior tranche subordination was 34.43%.

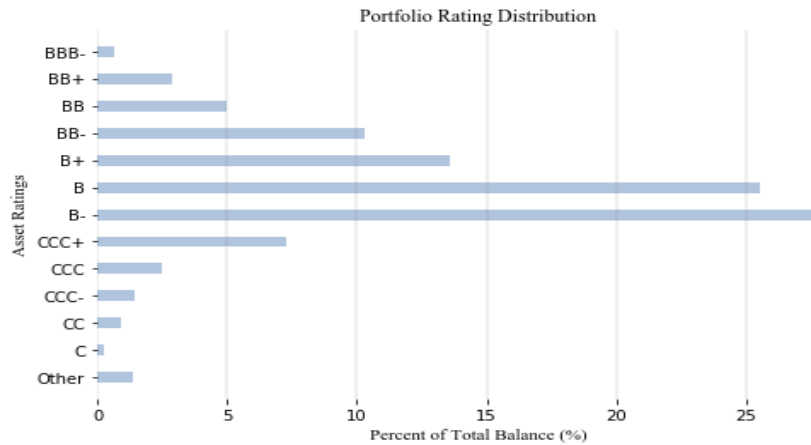
Top 10 Industry Contribution

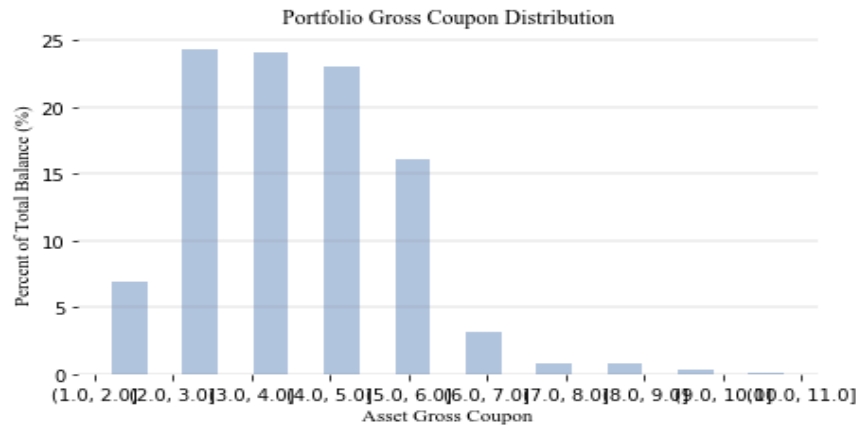

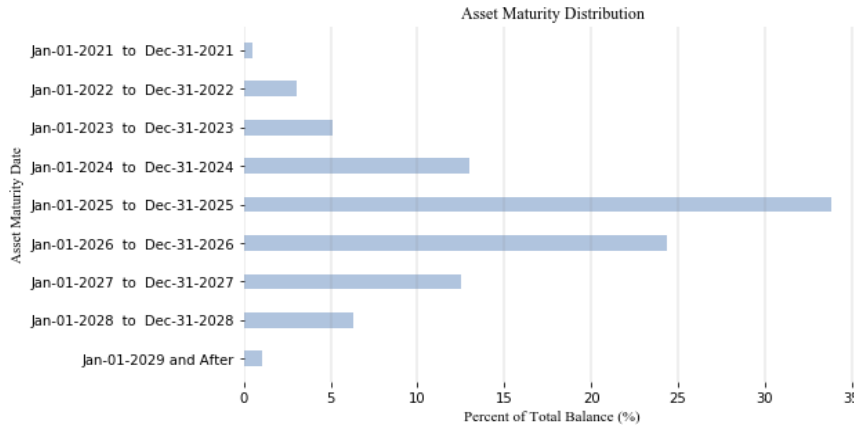

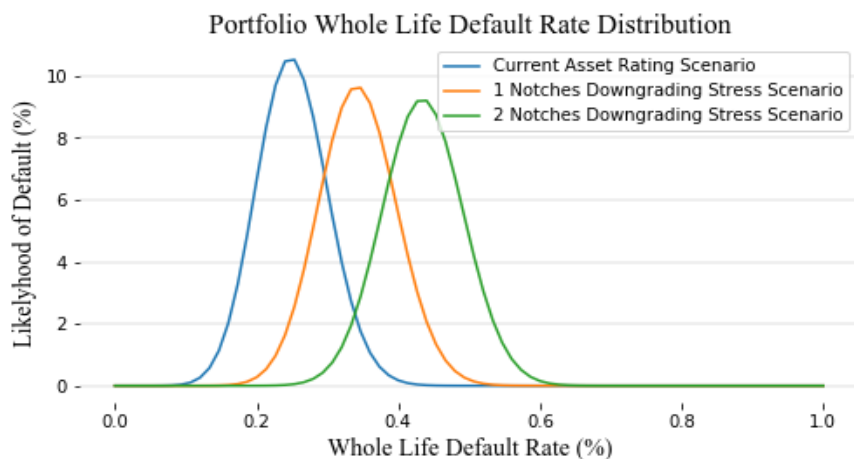
The underlying assets have maturity dates from August 31, 2020 to April 28, 2028. 1605.0% of the underlying assets will mature within 3 years, while another 2728.0% of the underlying assets have maturities beyond 5 years.

There are 703 assets in the underlying collateral pool, 99.65% are senior secured loans, and 0.35% with lower seniority.

### Stress Analysis



In EJR's view, the credit quality for syndicated loans has been under pressure recently. Unfortunately, ratings on some loans may be cut multiple notches with little notice. In EJR's base case, we took an one notch cut to the underlying assets to reflect the credit quality of each tranche created by market pressure. In EJR's stress case, we assumed a two notch cut to the underlying assets. According to EJR's Default Probability Table, the base case and stress case weighted average whole life default rate of probability can increase to 34.33% and 43.47%, respectively, from its current level of 25.09%.

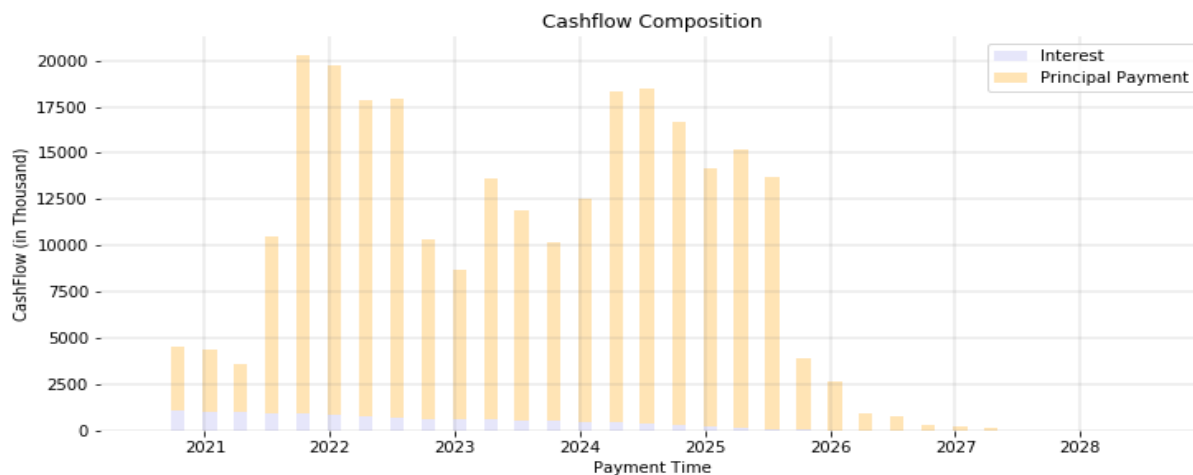
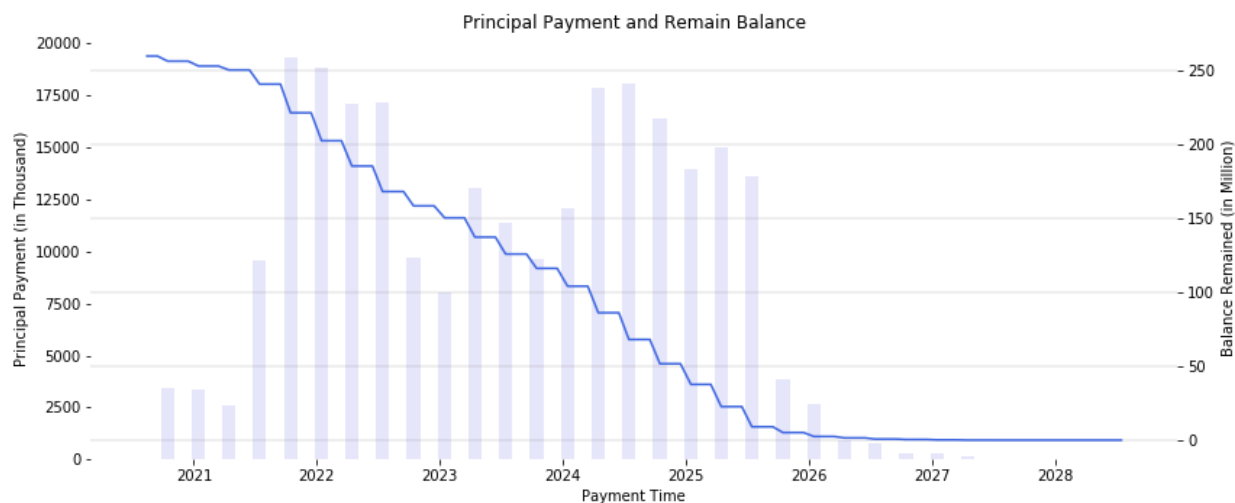
## Estimated Loss Information

Estimated loss is one of the key considerations in EJR's structured finance ratings. In times of stress when economic conditions are deteriorating, default rates and loss severity are more likely to increase relative to a portfolio's initial or base case default and loss severity levels. That is a tranche with higher rating should be able to withstand greater stress and sustain lower losses than a tranche with a lower rating. For example, a tranche with AAA rating should be able to survive the great depression scenario (the highest default and loss severity levels experienced if they were to occur in the future). An 'AA' rated tranche would be more susceptible to an adverse economic impact than the 'AAA' rated tranche, but nonetheless should be able to withstand such effects better than a tranche with a lower rating. EJR creates different stress levels based on different target tranche ratings (from AAA to B+). The detailed estimated loss (%) information of each tranche under each stress level is detailed in the below table:

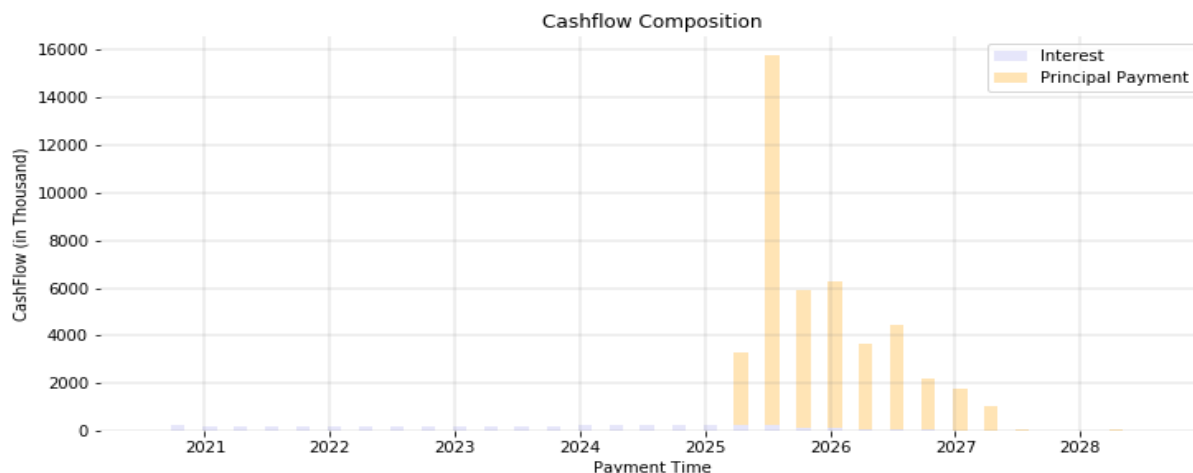
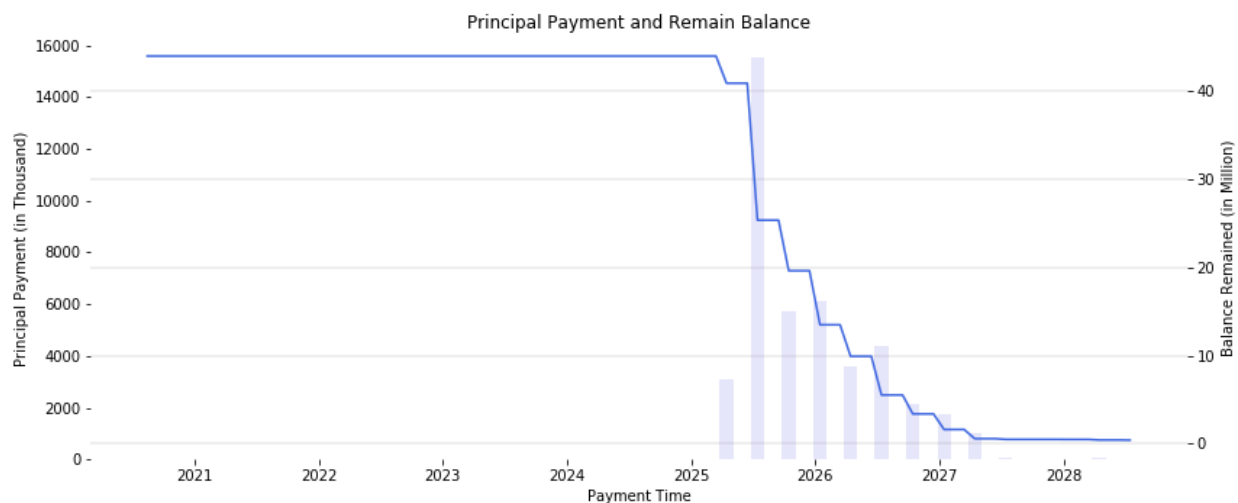

According to the weighted average cashflow output (under EJ's AA (sf) stress level of the whole life default rate, and assuming 50% loss will happen evenly in the first year, remaining 50% will happen evenly in the next 3 years), the payment window for this tranche ranges from August 15, 2020 to July 15, 2028. The current balance of the tranche is \$260.0M, by the end of the payment period (July 15, 2028), \$259.44M will be paid off. The remaining principal outstanding should be \$0.15M (which represents 0.06% of the tranche balance). Total interest payments of the tranche will total approximately \$12.53M.

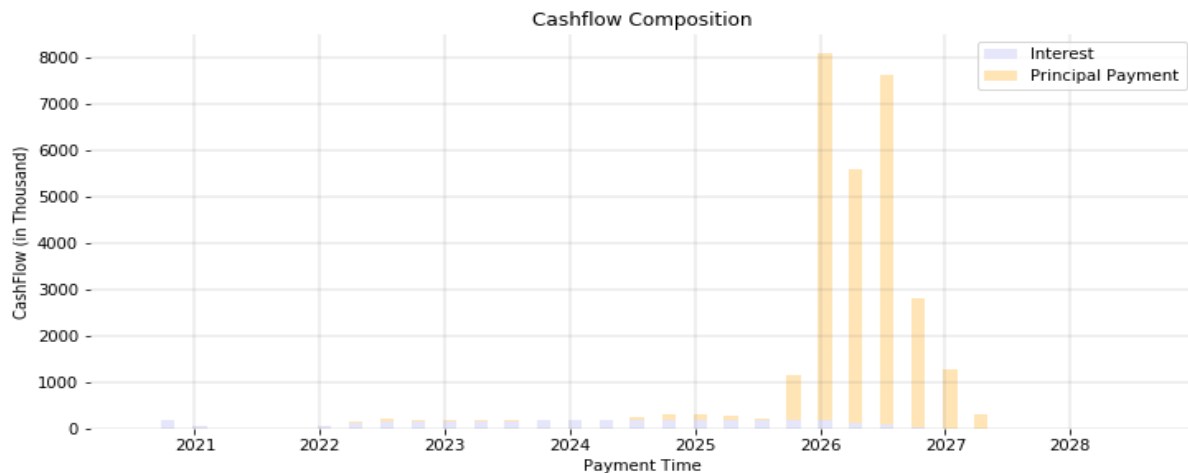
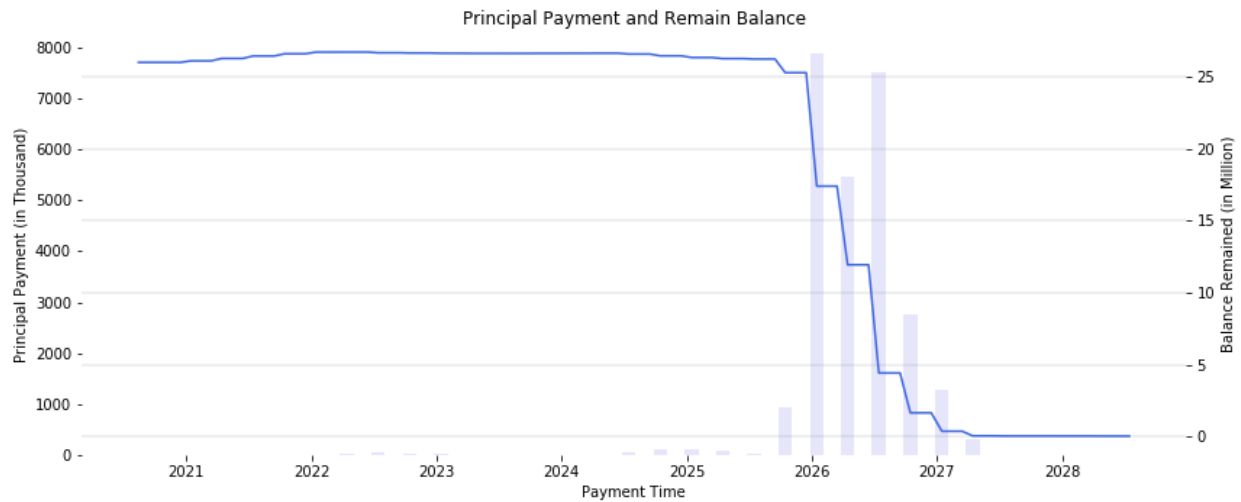

According to the weighted average cashflow output (under EJR's BBB+ (sf) stress level of the whole life default rate, and assuming 50% loss will happen evenly in the first year, remaining 50% will happen evenly in the next 3 years), the payment window for this tranche ranges from August 15, 2020 to July 15, 2028. The current balance of the tranche is \$44.0M, by the end of the payment period (July 15, 2028), \$43.61M will be paid off. The remaining principal outstanding should be \$0.38M (which represents 0.86% of the tranche balance). Total interest payments of the tranche will total approximately \$4.7M.

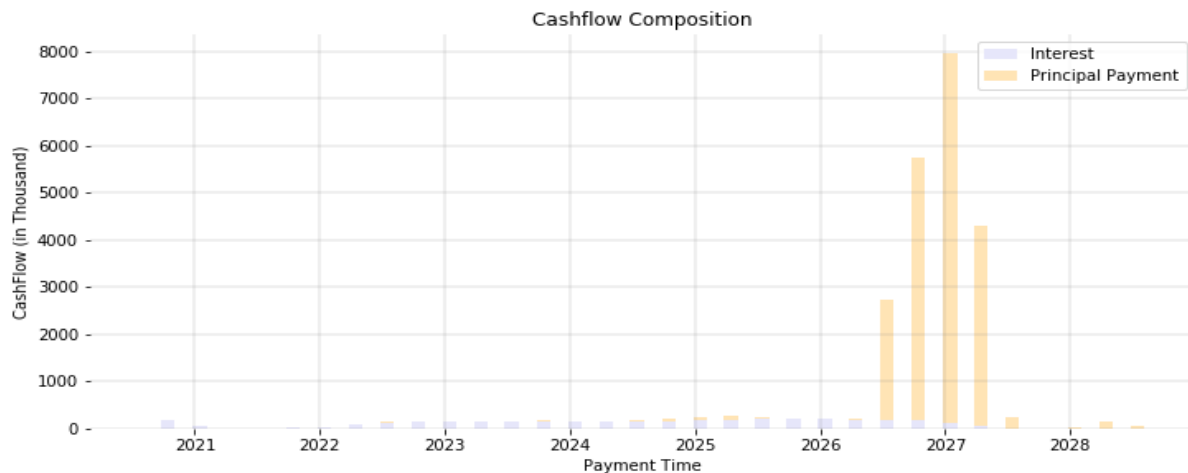
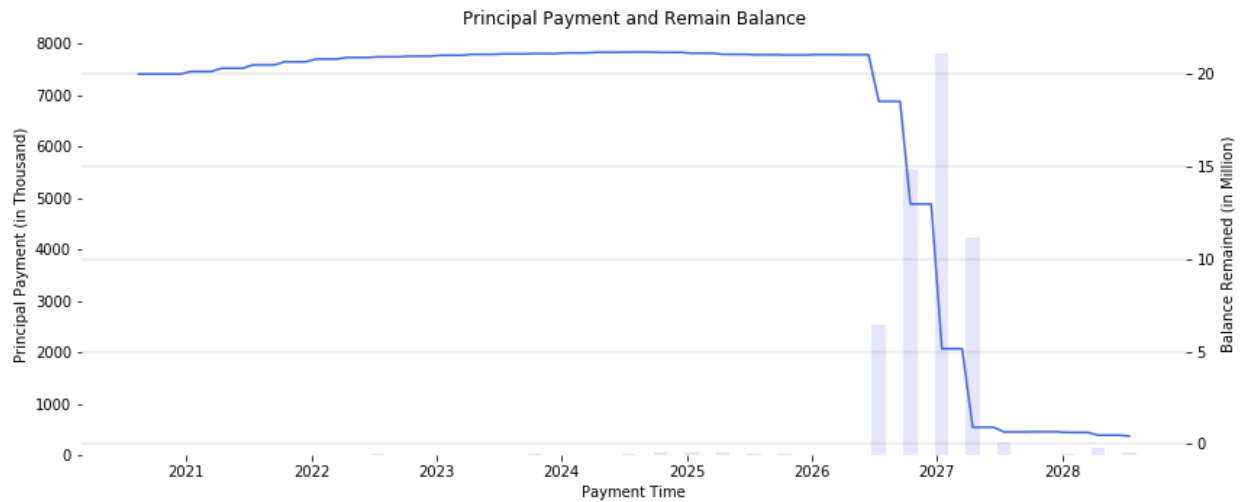


According to the weighted average cashflow output (under EJR's BB- (sf) stress level of the whole life default rate, and assuming 50% loss will happen evenly in the first year, remaining 50% will happen evenly in the next 3 years), the payment window for this tranche ranges from August 15, 2020 to July 15, 2028. The current balance of the tranche is \$26.0M, by the end of the payment period (July 15, 2028), \$26.8M will be paid off. The remaining principal outstanding should be \$0.02M (which represents 0.08% of the tranche balance). Total interest payments of the tranche will total approximately \$3.41M.

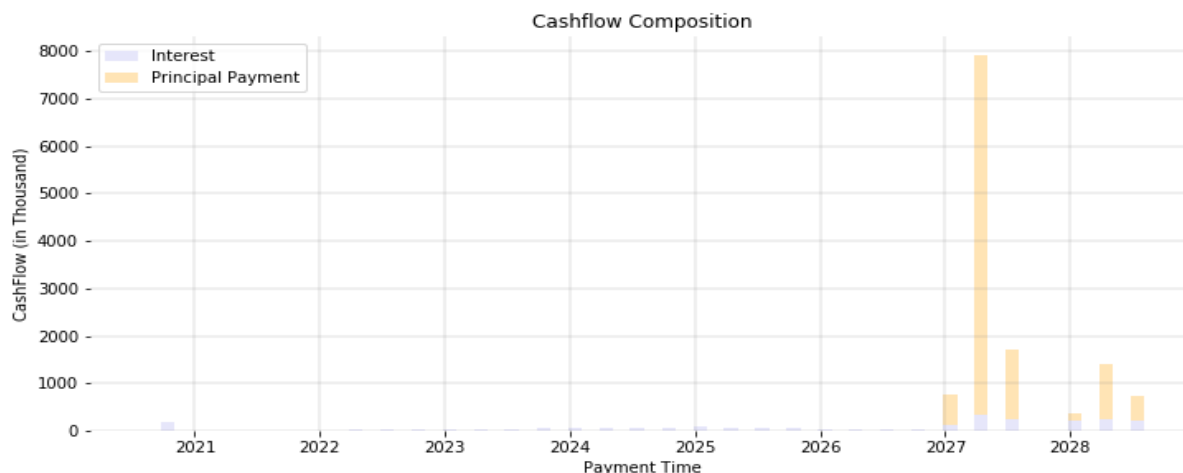
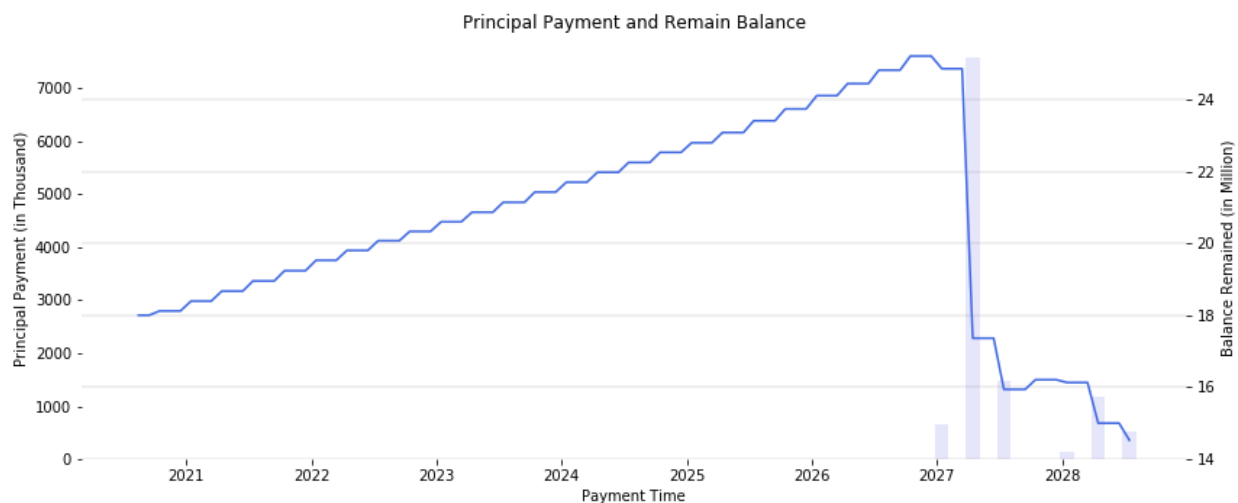

According to the weighted average cashflow output (under EJR's B (sf) stress level of the whole life default rate, and assuming 50% loss will happen evenly in the first year, remaining 50% will happen evenly in the next 3 years), the payment window for this tranche ranges from August 15, 2020 to July 15, 2028. The current balance of the tranche is \$20.0M, by the end of the payment period (July 15, 2028), \$21.05M will be paid off. The remaining principal outstanding should be \$0.42M (which represents 2.1% of the tranche balance). Total interest payments of the tranche will total approximately \$3.73M.

According to the weighted average cashflow output (under EJR's CC (sf) stress level of the whole life default rate, and assuming 50% loss will happen evenly in the first year, remaining 50% will happen evenly in the next 3 years), the payment window for this tranche ranges from August 15, 2020 to July 15, 2028. The current balance of the tranche is \$18.0M, by the end of the payment period (July 15, 2028), \$11.56M will be paid off. The remaining principal outstanding should be \$14.27M (which represents 79.28% of the tranche balance). Total interest payments of the tranche will total approximately \$2.47M.

## EJR's Key Rating Features & Differences Compare With Other NRSROs

Below is a summary of EJ's approach (see our Methodology for a more complete description):

1. Our rating is derived from estimated losses.
2. To reflect the current bearish credit conditions, assets in the collateral pool are assumed to be one notch lower than that currently assigned by other NRSROs.
3. The probabilities of default and estimated losses utilized are generally more conservative than industry standards.
4. Similarly, the recovery rates applied are lower relative to industry benchmarks.
5. EJ's analysis is conducted using information and cash flow engines supplied by a recognized industry service provider.
6. Subject to economic conditions, EJ may cap its highest rating at "AA" and apply an additional downgrade of up to two notches for each tranche.

There are three notches in each of EJR's rating category (e.g., A-(sf), A(sf) and A+(sf) for category A(sf) except for AAA(sf), CC(sf), C(sf) and D(sf).

### 2. The version of the procedure or methodology used to determine the credit rating as required by Paragraph (a)(1)(ii)(B) of Rule 17g-7:

We are using the EJR CLO methodology (Non-NRSRO) approved by Feb 26, 2020 and the Methodologies for Determining Credit Ratings (Main Methodology) version 14 published by Feb 03,2020.

### 3. The main assumptions and principles used in constructing the procedures and methodologies used to determine the credit rating as required by Paragraph (a)(1)(ii)(C) of Rule 17g-7:

The credit rating assigned reflects EJR's judgement regarding the future credit quality of the issue. The major assumptions used to construct the methodologies include:

- 1). Past data reflects the performance and credit worthiness of the pooled assets and is useful for analysis.
- 2). Financial and credit information that EJR gets from the issuer or the third party is reliable and accurate.
- 3). The economy and regulation policies will remain stable in the foreseeable future.

Specific quantitative assumptions used in this credit analysis applied to the collateral assets, which include Default Rate and Recovery Rate. According to the methodology, EJR converts the collateral assets into numbers of identical independent assets with the same default rate and recovery rate. The number of these converted assets is the Diversity Score.

### 4. The potential limitations of the credit rating as required by Paragraph (a)(1)(ii)(D) of Rule 17g-7:

EJR's rating pertains solely to EJR's view of current and prospective credit quality. EJR's rating does not address pricing, liquidity or other risks associated with holding investments in the issuer. EJR ratings

- 1). Are not intended to address the value, price, price stability, liquidity, suitability, or merit of an investment.
- 2). Do not address investment merit, whether a particular rated security is suitable for a particular investor or suitable for an investor's risk tolerance.
- 3). Do not address whether the expected return of a particular investment is adequate for the inherent risk.
- 4). Do not address whether the market value of the security will remain stable over time.
- 5). Are not exact measures of the probability of default but are instead expressions of the relative credit risk of issuers and debt instruments.
- 6). Are not recommendations to buy, sell or hold any security.

EJR's rating is dependent on numerous factors including the reliability, accuracy, and quality of the data used in determining the credit rating. The data is sourced from issuers' publicly disclosed reports, or from third-party data vendors. For solicited rating reports, EJR may also use the information provided by the client. In some cases, the information is limited because of issues such as the lack of reported data. Such shortcomings are not always readily apparent. EJR aims to identify such shortcomings and make adjustments using its best judgement.

EJR does not utilize third-party due diligence services.

EJR's rating aims to assess the possible loss of investing in the obligations. Factors which affect such projection, and in turn EJRs rating, include changes in the credit worthiness of the collateral assets, changes in the correlation between them, and overall economic changes.

**12. Information on the content of the credit rating as required by Paragraph (a)(1)(ii)(L) of Rule 17g-7:**

1). As this is a new credit rating, historical performance is not applicable.

2). As discussed in EJRs CLO Methodology, EJRs attempts to calculate the weighted average default probability of the portfolio by using EJRs<sup>TM</sup> Weighted Average Rating Score (WARS) approach. EJRs<sup>TM</sup> ratings of CLO tranches are based on the estimated losses (EL) generated by applying default scenarios based on likelihood of occurrence. However, EJRs<sup>TM</sup> credit ratings are not based on absolute measures of probability of default and expected loss. EJRs<sup>TM</sup> credit ratings are opinions about the relative creditworthiness of an entity or an instrument.




