#### **Transaction Summary**

We are providing the rating of Marathon CLO VI as a Non-NRSRO rating. The transaction closed on May 13, 2014. It had a reinvestment period, which ended on May 13, 2020. It has a maturity date of May 13, 2028. The Dealer and Trustee are JPMorgan and Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, respectively. The issued notes are collateralized by 99.7 senior secured loans, cash, and eligible investments with the balance of the portfolio consisting of -98.7 second lien loans and senior unsecured loans. Marathon Asset Management serves as the collateral manager.


#### Top 10 Industry Contribution

Portfolio Rating Distribution







In EJR's view, ratings on loans may be upgraded or downgraded with little notice. In EJR's optimistic case, we assumed an notch upgrade one to the underlying assets. In EJR's stress casees, we assumed one or two notch cut to the underlying assets reflect possible market to pressure. According to EJR's Default Probability Table, the optimistic case, base case, one notch cut and two notches cut casees weighted average whole life default rate of probability are 14.0%, 19.8%, 34.4% and 47.4%, respectively.

#### **Estimated Loss Information**

Estimated loss is one of the key considerations in EJR's structured finance ratings. In times of stress when economic conditions are deteriorating, default rates and loss severity are more likely to increase relative to a portfolio's initial or base case default and loss severity levels. EJR believes a tranche with higher rating should be able to withstand greater stress and sustain lower losses than a tranche with a lower rating. For example, a tranche with AAA rating should be able to survive the great depression scenario (the highest default and loss severity levels experienced if they were to occur in the future). A 'AA' rated tranche would be more susceptible to an adverse economic impact than the 'AAA' rated tranche, but nonetheless should be able to withstand such effects better than a tranche with a lower rating. EJR creates different stress levels based on different target tranche ratings (from AAA to B+). 

The credit rating assigned reflects EJR's judgement regarding the future credit quality of the issue. The major assumptions used to construct the methodologies include: 1) Past data reflects the performance and credit worthiness of the pooled assets and is useful for analysis. 2) Financial and credit information that EJR gets from the issuer or the third party is reliable and accurate. 3) The economy and regulation policies will remain stable in the foreseeable future. Specific quantitative assumptions used in this credit analysis applied to the collateral assets, which include Default Rate and Recovery Rate. According to the methodology, EJR converts the collateral assets into numbers of identical independent assets with the same default rate and recovery rate. The number of these converted assets is the Diversity Score.

EJR's rating pertains solely to EJR's view of current and prospective credit quality.
