Analyst: Carla Mae Caronongan Reviewer: Jesse Flowers Federal Agricultural Mortgage Corporation Class C (AGM) is in the govt support firms sector and its operating income was \$144.3M for the quarter ending March 2023 vs. \$103.9M for the prior year. Net income for the March 2023 quarter was \$47.0M vs. the prior year's \$47.8M income.

Founded in 1987 and is headquartered in Washington, DC, AGM engages in the provision of a secondary market for agricultural real estate and rural housing mortgage loans, rural utilities loans, and loans guaranteed by the United States Department of Agriculture. For the quarter ended Mar'23, the Company's net income inched down by 1.68% YoY primarily attributable to higher costs and expenses. The Company's revenues increased by 38.6% YoY (+9.7% seq.) for FQE Mar'23 mainly due to a \$109.17M (+117.4%) increase in interest income partially offset by higher interest expense (+95.9%). Operating income increased from \$103.9M last year to \$144.3M this year (+38.9%) as a result of the \$109.2M (+117.4%) rise in interest income and the \$0.8M decline in provisions for loan losses. Funds from operations for the FQE Mar '23 were \$144.3M resulting in a funds from operations interest coverage of 1.7x. Regarding leverage, total debt rose from \$23.0B to \$24.8B for the FQE '23 while total shareholder's equity was almost flat at \$1.3B. As a result, leverage was 95.1%. Net debt was \$24.0B for the most recent FQE and the resulting net leverage ratio was 94.9%. Market Cap is \$1.5B (as of 05/23/2023). Affirming.



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

REVENUE & PROFITABILITY

The Company's interest income rose at an average rate of 1.71% over the last five years while Operating Margin rose to 2.93% for the fiscal year ending December 2022, above the 2.47% average over the prior four years. Return on Assets rose to 0.65%, above the 0.52% average for the prior years.

VALUATION DRIVER: Interest Income Growth

Federal Agricultural Mortgage Corporation Class C (AGM) has grown its interest income at 38.6% per annum in the last fiscal year. We expect the Company's revenues will grow approximately 4.6% per annum over the next couple of years and 4.6% per annum for the next couple of years thereafter.

VALUATION DRIVER: Net Interest Margin

The Company's net interest margin has been more than its peers and we assumed a 1.8% net interest margin over the next two years.





For the issue Federal Agricultural Mortgage Corporation Class C with the ticker of AGM we have assigned the senior unsecured rating of A. There are three notches in our rating categories (e.g., A- A, and A+) except for AAA and those deep into speculative grade, i.e., CC, C, and D do not have notches.

Our rating pertains solely to our view of current and prospective credit quality. Our rating does not address pricing, liquidity, or other risks associated with holding investments in the issuer. EJR ratings

In some cases, the Information is limited because of issues such as short operating histories, lack of reported data, delay in reporting data, restatements, inaccurate accounting, and other issues. Such shortcomings are not always readily apparent.
